

## **VGIC Accomplishments in 2009**

**Economic Impact Analysis:** which was due to be finished last year, was delayed until NASS could hire new staff in March. Then we received notice that the analyst was being laid off in October and the survey would not be finished. Through discussions with Commissioner of Agriculture, Todd Haymore, funds were found to finish the survey by December 15, 2009. Additionally, over \$20,000 has been pledged to take this information and have it extrapolated into a total Economic Impact of the Green Industry to the Commonwealth by Scott Sink in the Virginia Tech Agricultural and Applied Economics Department in early 2010.

**Additional Outreach** by VGIC President, Lin Diacont, has been carried out to solicit additional participation of associations and companies in the green industry.

**Virginia Agribusiness Council Appreciation Banquet:** Provided centerpieces for the tables at the banquet and other decorations and each piece had signage with the VGIC logo along with information about the Green Industry, which helps make our industry more visible to our legislators and their aides.

**Arbor Day** – Co-sponsored the Virginia Arbor Day Ceremony on the Capitol grounds. With representatives from the VGIC, VNLA and VDACS, Tony Griffin (Capitol Building & Grounds), who accepted the trees for the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The 4<sup>th</sup> annual Virginia GoGreen Garden Festival<sup>sm</sup> was successfully completed on Saturday, September 12 at the Science Museum of Virginia in Richmond with many exhibitors and educational programs in the stand-alone event. The program featured Andre Viette's live radio show "IN THE GARDEN". There were keynote presentations by Dr. Alex Niemiera, Virginia Tech Horticulture, Dr. Mike Goatley, Virginia Tech Turfgrass, Andre Viette and others. The VGIC had sales of over \$2,400 from donated plant material from Virginia growers and an net income of over \$4,500.

**State Fair Horticulture Gardens:** The VGIC members provided a bountiful supply of plant material to provide and enhanced color landscape for these gardens during the State Fair, which were then sold at the end of the Fair, generating additional revenues for the Council. Many members also donated plant material and installation labor for permanent plantings at the new State Fair site at the Meadow Farm in Caroline County. The VGIC sponsored the high school student gardens and provided the awards for the competition.

**Monthly Bulletins** on current events and updates have been expanded this year as electronic E-News updates to the green industry by Jeff Miller.

**Gardening News Releases:** The VGIC released seasonal news releases that were used, reaching contacts in daily and non-daily newspapers, websites as well as regional and national magazines.

**GoGreen gardening articles** continue to be written by Jeff Miller, Virginia Certified Horticulturist, and submitted to newspapers statewide by VDACS and by the VGIC office. The Value of Landscaping was a popular article this spring, leaf mulch mowing, Trees for Troops and Christmas tips releases.

<u>www.VirginiaGreen.org</u> (the trade website) continues to be the "go to" website for the most extensive green industry calendar of events, as well as industry information and resources.

<u>www.VirginiaGardening.com</u> (the consumer website) continues to grow with resources and information for Virginia Gardening information from all segments of the green industry.

**Publicity** – Sylvia Wright continued to provide an extensive array of news releases and articles promoting the VGIC, resulting in coverage of the VGIC and events in numerous state, regional and national publications.
